Greenschools News

Coill na nÓg is a native tree and hedgerow planting initiative delivered by Biodiversity in Schools and funded by a selection of county councils across the island of Ireland. Our School received 9 bare-rooted trees to create a mini-woodland or Coill na nÓg (Wood of the Youth). 3rd class, with the help of Nicky, our caretaker, planted oak, hazel, hawthorn, silver birch, rowan and alder trees on the 12th December 2023.

Last week the Greenschools Committee hosted an <u>Action Day</u> on 26th Jan '24 for our <u>Global</u> <u>Citizenship – Litter and Waste Flag.</u>

We are learning about the ways we are connected with people and communities around the world. Our aim is to be active citizens and to find ways to work together to create a more fair and sustainable world.

Junior Assembly Topics: Composting, recycling, Global Connections survey, Picker Pals-Litter Picking Senior Assembly Topics: Global Goals, Fair Trade, Circular Economy, Yard Cleaning Committee. Sustainable Development Goals

These are 17 goals and targets that outline a vision for the future, for people and the planet. These goals have the power to end poverty, fight inequality and stop climate change.

6th **Class** told us about goal no.6 which is all about ensuring everyone has access to <u>Clean Water &</u> <u>Sanitation</u>. We can all help by conserving water, spreading awareness and supporting organisations like <u>Kersia</u> and <u>Impact Water Foundation</u>. We will be doing fundraising in our school to help them provide clean water and proper sanitation facilities to ten schools in Kenya.

5th **Class** shared information on goal no.15 <u>Life on Land</u>. We heard about desertification and why it's important to take care of the environment.

4th **Class** "Before we have finished eating breakfast in the morning, we have depended on more than half the world!" They told us about <u>Fair Trade</u> which means people get fairly treated & fairly paid for their work.

3rd Class told us about the <u>Circular Economy</u>. We need to try to reuse things instead of throwing them away!

2nd Class informed us of their ongoing Litter Picking adventures with the Picker Pals. "The earth is our island and we all have to try and make the world a better place". Important message: PLEASE DON'T LITTER!

1st **Class & Senior Infants** looked at the connections we have with people all around the world. They looked at where drinks, food, clothes are made as well as connections with famous sports stars, singers and holidays around the world.

Ms. Lacey and Mrs. Clancy's classes reminded us about what goes in our recycling and compost bins. We are trying to **reduce** what goes in our rubbish bins.

Recycle as much cardboard, paper and plastic as possible in the classrooms and at home. Make sure it is clean and dry. As it is not practical to wash out <u>yogurt cartons etc</u> in the classroom, children are **bringing these home to wash and recycle. Compost** fruit cores etc. and pencil toppings.Please continue to collect used **batteries** and send them into school to be **recycled**. This is good for the environment and also helps the children's hospice LauraLynn.

We can all work together to make a positive impact on the planet and ensure a better future for all!

Active Schools/Health-Promoting News

Happy new year to you all from the Active schools .We began 2024 with **Step into January** and now hope to move on to Flipping February and Marathon March. In **Flipping February** we will focus on the dance with "Go Noodle" and "Just Dance" and the fundamental movement Sidestepping. We will also concentrate on tumbling head over heels. **Marathon March** will see us progress from walking in January to our running initiative for the year where we will try to improve our running ability. We are also bringing back the ever popular "**Walk it Wednesday**" with juniors walking around the school and seniors walking around the pitches. We also hope to do a Walk a Week for each class .This means that each class will have to commit to do at least one walk a week where one

child will be used as the tracker child for the class. Using their Fitbit, we will tally the steps for the walk and we hope to hit 50,000 steps a week for the school. A chart will be put up on the Active School board and each class will fill in their steps. For this term also, we hope to focus on an exercise a week to build strength and endurance.

We will begin with the plank. We hope every class will do a plank a day for a minute at least .The Active School Committee will announce the new exercise every week and it will be displayed on the Active Board. We will also run a competition in the coming months to decorate our board. Here's to another great year of good health and activity.

We have been able to buy new novels for all the classes, sets of books for the Book club and some non-fiction books for some classes.
