Spring Planting 2021

Lots of classes are busy planting seeds in our school garden at the moment. We look forward to watching them grow! 1st Class are taking part again in the **Incredible Edibles Programme**. This is a fun, interactive project where children learn about the origin of food and learn about the Bord Bia Quality Mark. They will also be helping to make a healthy dish at home and taking part in Healthy Eating Week next term. We are currently embarking on the growing element of the project and have planted strawberries and potatoes in the tunnel. We also sowed lots of seeds – carrots, chives, turnips, spinach and lettuce! We can't wait to taste these yummy foods!
