Parents' Association

Thanks to all who supported the PA's Lotto fundraiser. The response was excellent. This is the PA's main fundraiser each year and, with the Covid restrictions that are in place, it may be one of only a very few ways of raising income. Monies raised by the PA are used to purchase additional resources for the pupils. For example, last year €9000 from PA funds were used to help purchase 70inch Promethean Touchscreen Panels for classrooms. The current Lotto runs for 10 weeks. There will be another opportunity to support it in early January.

Book Bills

Thanks to all who have paid their book bills so promptly. As well as a Book Rental Fee the Book Bill includes Personal Pupils Insurance at €8 which affords your child 24hr cover 12 months of the year. We also request €15 for art and crafts materials and €15 for photocopying. These items are much needed funds as, for example, our annual photocopying bill is in excess of €6000. The vast majority of this photocopying is comprised of worksheets for classes, pupils project work and other classroom resources. We would ask those with outstanding Book Bills to pay as soon as possible. Some parents/guardians may find it difficult to pay Book Rental Bills at the beginning of the school year for various reasons – e.g. large number of children attending school, single parent families, medical card holders, unemployment, etc. This year might be particularly challenging because of Coronavirus. If you require assistance, please contact the principal (if you haven't already done so), as a limited amount of money is made available by the Department to help in such circumstances.

Covid-19

The Board would like to inform parents that the product we are using to clean and sanitise the school is called Klorkleen. Klorkleen is a chlorine based soluble tablet produced by Wexford based company Medentech. As well as being completely safe, it is a more environmentally friendly alternative to traditional bleaches and is used widely in hospitals around the world.

We would also like to point out, as you are no doubt aware, that fresh air and good ventilation are key for mitigating against the spread of the Coronovirus. To this end, windows in classrooms will have to be left opened even during winter months. Even though the heating will be on, it may be worth considering purchasing a base layer/skins/vest for your child in preparation for the colder days ahead.
